VERIFIED COMPLAINT

Plaintiff states the following as his Complaint:

- This is a Complaint for declaratory and injunctive relief, seeking a declaration that, a
 Richmond County ordinance is preempted by state law and cannot be enforced against
 dealers in used firearms or other weapons.
- 2. Defendant is the sheriff of Richmond County, Georgia.
- 3. Plaintiff Kevin Fox is a natural person who resides in Columbia County, Georgia and works and does business in Richmond County, Georgia.
- 4. Plaintiff GeorgiaCarry.Org, Inc. ("GCO") is a non-profit corporation organized under the laws of Georgia.
- 5. The mission of GCO is to foster the rights of its members to keep and bear arms.
- 6. Fox is a member of GCO.
- 7. On or about May 7, 2013, Richmond County enacted Ordinance # 7409.
- 8. Ordinance # 7409 regulates certain transactions of used property.
- 9. Defendant is charged with enforcement of Ordinance # 7409.

- 10. Defendant interprets Ordinance # 7409 to apply to transactions involving firearms and other weapons.
- 11. Ordinance # 7409 imposes a waiting period of 10 days after a dealer obtains certain property before the dealer may transfer or sell such property.
- 12. On or about July 26, 2014, Fox attempted to transfer a firearm from an individual in South Carolina to an individual in Georgia, via a federal firearms licensee (i.e., gun dealer) in Augusta, Richmond County, Georgia.
- 13. The licensee (and several other licensees with whom Fox discussed the issue) told Fox that Defendant's enforcement of Ordinance # 7409 requires a 10-day waiting period on the transfer of used firearms.
- 14. O.C.G.A. § 16-11-173 prohibits counties from regulating the sale of firearms "in any manner."
- 15. By enforcing Ordinance # 7409 against dealers of used firearms, Defendant is violating the prohibition of O.C.G.A. § 16-11-173.
- 16. GCO has other members that engage in lawful transactions of firearms and other weapons involving dealers in Richmond County, Georgia
- 17. Such other members are harmed by Defendant's enforcement of Ordinance # 7409 in firearms and other weapons transactions.

Relief Demanded

Plaintiffs demand the following relief:

18. A declaration that Ordinance #7409 is preempted by O.C.G.A. § 16-11-173 to the extent Ordinance #7409 applies to transactions involving firearms and other weapons.

- 19. An injunction prohibiting Defendant from applying Ordinance #7409 to transactions involving firearms and other weapons.
- 20. An interlocutory injunction prohibiting Defendant from enforcing Ordinance # 7409 on transactions involving firearms and other weapons.
- 21. Statutory damages for violation of O.C.G.A. § 16-11-173 in the amount of \$100.
- 22. Reasonable attorney's fees pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 16-11-173(g).
- 23. The costs of bringing and maintaining this action.
- 24. A jury to try this case.
- 25. Any other relief the court deems proper.
